

# Customer Service Advice from Telstra.

## Extreme Weather events impact service in central Queensland

Telstra is working to manage the significant impact to Telstra services that has occurred as a result of a series of extreme weather events in the central region of Queensland, on or about, Sunday 21 March 2010.

Due to the effect of damage to the Telstra telecommunications network by Tropical Cyclone Ului, there has been a significant increase in the number of Telstra services being reported as faulty. As a result, there has been some disruption to service and delays to normal installation and repair activities.

Telstra apologises to any affected customers.

Information as to the nature of these severe weather events can be sourced from the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM). Heavy rainfall and damaging winds referred to in the BOM Severe Weather Warning issued for 21 March 2010 initially at 12:52am EST on Sunday the 21st of March 2010; all of which were widely reported in the news media after the events.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances applies to approximately 1928 services. This number may increase as Telstra assesses the full affect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of normal service operations is expected to be 6 April 2010. This date is indicative only; Telstra customers should anticipate that some further delays may occur. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are; in the area bounded by and including, but is not limited to the area starting at Toolakea follow the coastline southeast past Townsville, Mackay and Rockhampton to Port Alma, then go west southwest to Bajool, then west to Gogango, then southwest to Woorabinda, then north northeast to Tooloombah, then west to Dysart, northwest to Mount Coolon, then north to Dalbeg, then northwest to Woodstock and further northwest to the southern most point of the Paluma Range National Park, then go northeast back to the coast at Toolakea. All suburbs, towns, off shore islands and coastal areas serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an extension to time frames applying under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2000 (No.2)*. This means that Telstra is notifying customers that normal service time frames may not be met during the period of **22 March 2010 to 6 April 2010** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice).
