

# CUSTOMER SERVICE ADVICE FROM TELSTRA

## Extreme Weather events impact service in Southwest District

Telstra is working to manage the significant impact to Telstra services that has occurred as a result of a series of extreme weather events in the Southwest District region of WA on or about Saturday 5 May 2012.

Due to the effect of damage to the Telstra telecommunications network by severe thunderstorms, there has been a significant increase in the number of Telstra services being reported as faulty. As a result, there has been some disruption to service and delays to normal installation and repair activities.

Telstra apologises to any affected customers.

Information as to the nature of these severe weather events can be sourced from the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM). Heavy rainfall conducive to flash flooding is referred to in the BOM Severe Weather Warning issued for 5 May 2012 initially at 3:50 am on Saturday 5 May 2012; all of which were widely reported in the news media after the events.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances may apply to approximately 400 services. Some of these services may not be installed or repaired within Telstra's standard time frames. The number of possibly affected services may increase or decrease as Telstra assesses the full effect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of Telstra's normal service operations is expected to be 18 May 2012. This date is indicative only, however, and may be subject to change once the full impact of the extreme weather conditions has been assessed. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are in the area bounded by and including, but are not limited to the area starting on the coast at Cape Bouvard near Yalgorup National Park, head southeast through Coolup, Marradong, Quindanning to Darkan. From Darkan head south to Dinninup then go southwest through Pemberton to the Windy Harbour of the D'Entrecasteaux National Park. From Windy Harbour follow the coastline west to Augusta and then continue to follow the Coastline north back to Cape Bouvard. All suburbs and towns, off shore islands and coastal areas serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an exemption from compliance with time frames and performance standards required under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*. Therefore Telstra is notifying customers that normal installation and repair time frames may not be met during the period from **7 May 2012 to 18 May 2012** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice) and, under section 21 of the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*, Telstra will be exempt from complying with performance standards during this period.
