

Customer Service Advice from Telstra

Extreme Weather events impact service in South East and East Coast Districts of Tasmania.

Telstra is working to manage the significant impact to Telstra services that has occurred as a result of a series of extreme weather events in the South East and East Coast regions of Tasmania on or about Sunday 9 February 2014.

Due to the effect of damage to the Telstra telecommunications network by severe weather, there has been a significant increase in the number of Telstra services being reported as faulty. As a result, there has been some disruption to service and delays to normal installation and repair activities.

Telstra apologises to any affected customers.

Information as to the nature of these severe weather events can be sourced from the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM). Damaging winds are referred to in the BOM Severe Weather Warning issued for 9 February 2014 initially at 4:04 am EDT on Sunday 9 February 2014; all of which were widely reported in the news media after the events.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances may apply to approximately 700 services. Some of these services may not be installed or repaired within Telstra's standard time frames. The number of possibly affected services may increase or decrease as Telstra assesses the full effect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of Telstra's normal service operations is expected to be 28 February 2014. This date is indicative only, however, and may be subject to change once the full impact of the extreme weather conditions has been assessed. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are in the area bounded by and including, but not limited to, the area starting at Cape Tourville on the east coast of Tasmania following the coastline clockwise around Southern Tasmania to South Cape. From South Cape the area heads north to Lonnavaile, northeast to Collinsvale then northwest past Broadmarsh to Bothwell. From Bothwell the area turns northeast past Woodbury and Lake Leake to the southern end of the Douglas Aspley National Park. The area then heads southeast back to Cape Tourville. All suburbs and towns, off shore islands and coastal areas serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an exemption from compliance with time frames and performance standards required under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*. Therefore Telstra is notifying customers that normal installation and repair time frames may not be met during the period from **11 February 2014 to 28 February 2014** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice) and, under section 21 of the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*, Telstra will be exempt from complying with performance standards during this period.
