

Customer Service Advice from Telstra

Extreme Weather events impact service in Darling Downs and Granite Belt District of Queensland.

As previously notified by Telstra on Wednesday 17 December 2014, Telstra's normal operations in the Darling Downs and Granite Belt region of Queensland were affected by a series of extreme weather events on or about Thursday 11 December 2014. Telstra's telecommunications network in these areas have experienced high levels of damage that resulted in delays to installation and repair activities on a significant number of Telstra services. Due to the extent of damage to the Telstra network, the impact in the affected region has been greater than initially estimated, and as a consequence of the continued weather effects, the expected recovery date has now been extended to 1 February 2015.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances applies to an additional 700 services bringing the total number of services impacted to approximately 1,800 services. This number may increase as Telstra assesses the full affect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of normal service operations is expected to be 1 February 2015. This date is indicative only; Telstra customers should anticipate that some further delays may occur. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are in the area bounded by and including, but not limited to, the area starting at Cooyar heading southeast towards Toogoolawah, southwest past Grantham to Pilton and then southeast to Aratula. From Aratula the area turns south to the QLD/NSW border and following the border westerly past Texas and Goondiwindi to Mungindi. The area heads northeast to Teelba, southeast to Irongate, northeast past Biddeston to Kingsthorpe, and then north back to Cooyar. All suburbs and towns serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an extension to time frames applying under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*. This means that Telstra is notifying customers that normal service time frames may not be met during the period of **12 December 2014 to 1 February 2015** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice).
