

Customer Service Advice from Telstra

Extreme Weather events impact service in parts of the Darling Downs and Granite Belt and Maranoa and Warrego districts of Queensland and parts of North West Slopes & Plains district of New South Wales.

As previously notified by Telstra on Friday 27 March 2015, Telstra's normal operations in parts of the Darling Downs and Granite Belt and Maranoa and Warrego districts of Queensland and part of North West Slopes & Plains district of New South Wales were affected by a series of extreme weather events on or about Saturday 21 March 2015 through to Sunday 22 March 2015. Telstra's telecommunications network in these areas have experienced high levels of damage that resulted in delays to installation and repair activities on a significant number of Telstra services. Due to the extent of damage to the Telstra network, the impact in the affected region has been greater than initially estimated, and as a consequence of the continued weather effects, the expected recovery date has now been extended to 17 May 2015.

Telstra has identified that the effect of these circumstances applies to an additional 650 services bringing the total number of services impacted to approximately 1,400 services. This number may increase as Telstra assesses the full affect of the extreme weather conditions. Based on current information, the resumption date of normal service operations is expected to be 17 May 2015. This date is indicative only; Telstra customers should anticipate that some further delays may occur. Telstra regrets any inconvenience caused to customers and thanks them for their patience while this work is being undertaken.

Telstra services encompassed in this exemption are in the area bounded by and including, but not limited to, the area starting at Robinson Gorge in Queensland heading southeast past Taroom to Jandowae. The area then turns south to Milmerran, northeast to Cambooya and southeast to Aratula. From Aratula the area turns south, crossing into New South Wales to Woodenbong, then southwest to Tenterfield, west past Yetman to Weemelah. The area then crosses back across the Queensland border heading north to Coomrith and then northwest to Bargunyah. From here the area heads north past Womalilla to Mt Moffat and then east back to Robinson Gorge. All suburbs and towns serviced by Telstra within these boundaries are encompassed in this exemption.

As these circumstances were outside of Telstra's control, Telstra is claiming an extension to time frames applying under the *Telecommunications (Customer Service Guarantee) Standard 2011*. This means that Telstra is notifying customers that normal service time frames may not be met during the period of **23 March 2015** to **17 May 2015** inclusive (based on Telstra's estimated recovery schedule correct at the time of publication of this notice).
