

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

Overview of your handset

Menu / OK -Enter the main menu. Select the option displayed on screen. Confirm menu option - OK is displayed on screen.

Navigational key / Volume / Call list - For scrolling up. Access to answered and missed calls. In call volume adjustment during calls.


Talk key/Speakerphone - Make or answer a call. Activate and deactivate hands-free during a call.

* asterisk key / Keypad lock - For entering asterisks. In standby mode press and hold to lock/unlock the keypad.

redial - Open the redial list.

- Clear / Mute / Back Delete characters while entering text. Mute / unmute the microphone during a call. Returns to previous menu step is displayed on the screen.
- **"End call"/Power Key** Press briefly to end a call or return to standby mode. Press and hold down to switch the handset on/off.
- ▼ Navigational key / Volume / Phonebook For scrolling down. Access to phonebook. In call volume adjustment during calls.
- **O** S Alphanumerical keypad For dialling telephone numbers.
- Hash key Press and hold down to switch handset ringer on/off. For entering the hash symbol. When entering names, switch between upper and lower case lettering. Press and hold to use Recall feature when connected to a PABX, and with some Telstra Calling Features e.g. Call Waiting

Handset display



Symbol Function

• Paging key - Press • on the base, all handsets ring. Press • again to cancel the paging call or press any key on the handset to stop the paging call. Press and hold to enter registration mode.

Charging light - Lights up when the handset is on the base.

- Please note that the ringer for incoming calls as well as signal tones are
 emitted on the handset loudspeaker. Do not therefore hold the handset close
 to your ear while one of these functions is on, otherwise your hearing may be
 affected.
- Use only the following supplied power supply: MN-A703-A145
- This product requires an electrical supply of 100 240 volts AC.
- · The mains power plug must always be easily accessible.
- To disconnect the device from mains, separate the plug from the wall socket first.

Rechargeable batteries

Use the two supplied rechargeable batteries:

1.2V AAA 550mAh by Sanik or High Power

Using other rechargeable batteries or non-rechargeable batteries/primary cells can be dangerous and cause malfunctions in or damage to the telephone.

Please NOTE:

- · Do not immerse batteries in water or throw in the fire.
- · Rechargeable batteries can become warm while recharging.
- This is normal and not dangerous.
- Do not use any other type of charger since this may damage the batteries.
- Before using the telephone, wearers of hearing aids should note that radio signals can be picked up by the hearing aid and cause an unpleasant buzzing noise.
- Do not use your cordless telephone in environments at risk from explosion (e.g. paintworks, petrol stations etc.)

GETTING STARTED

IMPORTANT

Do not place your Colombo Neue in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Location

You need to place your Colombo Neue base within 2 metres of the mains power socket and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach. The socket-outlet should be installed near the equipment and should be easily accessible.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Your Colombo Neue works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you place the base. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Handset range

The unit has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and the handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick concrete and stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The **II** icon on your handset indicates that you are within range of the base. When out of range of the base, the **II** icon disappears. If you are on a call, you will hear a warning beep.

If you are on a call, the line will hang up if the handset moves out of range of the base. Move back within range. The handset will automatically re-connect to the base.

Setting up

IMPORTANT

The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times. Use only the power adaptor and telephone line cord supplied with the product.




Connecting the base



- 1. Plug the telephone line cord into the socket marked 2 on the underside of the base.
- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked **Q** on the underside of the base and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket. Switch on the mains power.


Power up the handset

- The bottom part of the handset contains a battery compartment for housing two type AAA batteries.
- Remove the battery cover from the back of the handset and insert the 2 x AAA NiMH rechargeable batteries supplied. Please note the '+' and '-' markings inside the battery compartment and insert in the correct direction.



- 3. Slide the battery cover back into place.
- 4. Place the handset on the base to charge, see below.

Connecting the charger



1. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked \mathbb{Q} on the underside of the charger and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket. Switch on the mains power.

Charging the batteries

If the battery charge status has reached its lower limit, the battery symbol () flashes in the display and a warning signal is heard. You have only a few minutes of talk time left.

When charging, the \blacksquare icon will scroll on the display. Once charged scrolling will stop.

You can use the telephone for up to 15 hours with fully charged batteries. The handset has a standby time of up to 200 hours.

After you have inserted the batteries for the first time, the battery display will indicate the correct information on the charging status only after a complete charging cycle. Use only approved rechargeable batteries NiMH AAA. Never use disposable batteries/primary cells.

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time. Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of the rechargeable batteries will reduce with time, giving the handset less talk / standby time. Eventually it will need to be replaced.

Batteries and the handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

Date and time

If you have subscribed to a Caller ID service and Auto Clock is set to on, see "Switch auto clock on / off" on page 26, the date and time is set automatically for all handsets when you receive your first call. If Auto Clock is set to off the time and date does not set automatically.

If you do not have a Caller ID service, you can set the date and time manually.

- 1. Press ok, scroll ▼ to Clock/Alarm and press ok.
- 2. Date & Time is displayed. Press οκ.
- 3. Enter the date using the format DD-MM-YY e.g. 04/12/15 for 4 December 2015 and press ok .
- Enter the time using the 24 hour format HH:MM, e.g. 14:45 for 02.45pm and press on .
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Navigating the menus

The basic steps of navigating through the menu and on-screen options.

- 1. From the standby screen, press ok.

 The main menu is opened.
- 2. Use the \bigcirc key for up (\blacktriangle) or down (\blacktriangledown) to scroll through the menu.
- 3. Soft key options **OK** and are displayed.

 Press ok to select **OK** and open a sub-menu or validate an option.

 Press oc to go back to previous menu level, correct a character or cancel an action
- 4. Press 🖀 to return to standby.

NOTE

If you do not press any button on the handset for 30 seconds the display will automatically return to standby. It will also return to standby when the handset is placed on the base or charger.

MAKING AND RECEIVING CALLS

Make a call

- 1. Press ...
- 2. Dial the telephone number.

Pre-dial

- 1. Enter the phone number (maximum 24 digits). If you make a mistake press
- 2. Press 4 to dial the phone number entered.

Dial direct memory numbers 1 to 9

1. Press and hold a key from 1 to 9 until the number is displayed and dialled.

NOTE

To store a direct memory number see "Store a direct memory number" on page 21.

Call from the phonebook

- 1. Press ▼. The first entry in the phonebook is displayed.
- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press 4 to dial the number.
- 4. Press again to dial over hands-free.

NOTE

Instead of scrolling to browse the phonebook entries, press the numeric key corresponding to the first letter of the entry you wish to locate. For example, pressing $\frac{2}{\kappa}$ will show the entries starting with A. Pressing $\frac{2}{\kappa}$ twice will show the entries starting with B, etc...

Call from the Call list

NOTE

You need to subscribe to a Caller ID service to be able to see the caller's number in the Call list. See "Calls list" on page 22 for more details.

- 1. Press lacktriangle to enter the **Call List**. The most recent call is displayed.
- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press 4 to dial the number.
- 4. Press 4 again to dial over hands-free.

Answer a call

 When the phone rings and (flashes in the display, press to answer the call.

- 2. Press again to answer the call via hands-free.
- 3. To switch between hands-free and the earpiece press 4.

IMPORTANT

When the phone is ringing, avoid holding the earpiece too close to your ear as it may damage your hearing.

NOTE

If auto pick-up is on, see "Auto pick up" on page 28, simply lift up the handset from its base to answer the call. The default setting is Off, for all default settings, see "Default settings" on page 33.

An incoming call has priority over other events. Whenever there is an incoming call, other operations in progress such as phone settings, menu navigation, etc. will be ended.

Adjust volume

- During a call, press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the earpiece volume. The level is shown in the handset display.
- 2. During a hands-free call, press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the hands-free volume. The level is shown in the handset display.

Mute

Mute the microphone so that you can talk to someone else in the room without your caller hearing you.

- 1. During a call, press a c. The microphone is muted and **Mute On** is displayed.
- 2. Press again to turn the microphone back on.

End a call

1. Press 7.

After you hang up, the duration the phone is off-hook is displayed for 2 seconds.

NOTE

If auto hang-up is on, see "Auto hang up" on page 28, simply replace the handset on the base to end the call. The default setting is $\bf 0n$.

Switch handset on/off

Press and hold to switch the handset on or off.

Intercom

This feature is only available when there are at least 2 registered handsets. It allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another and use the conference option.

Call another handset

- 1 Press int
 - If you have two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.
 - If more than two handsets are registered to the base, the first handset number is displayed. Scroll ▼ to the number of the handset you want to call and press ometric or press * a to ring all handsets.
- 2. Press 7 to hang up.

NOTE

If the handset does not belong to Colombo Neue range, this function may not be available.

Transfer an external call to another handset

- During an external call, press int. Your caller is put on hold.
- Scroll ▼ to the number of the handset you want to call and press menu or press *a to ring all handsets.

If there are only two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.

 When the other handset answers, announce the caller then press to transfer the call. If the other handset does not answer, press int to talk to your caller again.

Three-party conference call

- During an external call, press int. Your caller is put on hold.
- Scroll ▼ to the number of the handset you want to call and press ^{menu}_{ok} or press *a to ring all handsets.

If there are only two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.

- When the other handset answers, announce the call then press and hold int
 to connect both calls. If the other handset does not answer, press int to talk to
 your caller again.
- 4. Press 7 to hang up.

Voicemail

If you have subscribed to Telsra's voicemail service (if available), your Colombo Neue displays 🍑 when you have a new message. 1

NOTE

You can turn off the 🍑 icon. When viewing the Call list, press and hold 🕺

PHONEBOOK

The Colombo Neue handset phonebook can store up to 100 names and numbers.

Numbers can be up to 24 digits long and names up to 12 characters long. Entries are stored in alphabetical order.

Dial phonebook entries

- 1. Press ▼. Display shows the first entry.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to the entry you want.

To search alphabetically, press ▼ then press the key with the first letter of the name, e.g. if the name begins with N, press to twice.

The display shows the first entry beginning with N. If required, press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to scroll to the exact entry.

3. Press 4 to dial the entry displayed.

Store an entry

- 1. Press ok . Phonebook is displayed.
- Press ^{menu}_{oκ}. Scroll ▼ to New Entry.
- 3. Press oK . Enter Name is displayed.
- 4. Enter a name and press ox.
- Enter a number. Press ^{menu}_{oκ} to save.
- 6. Press of to return to standby.

NOTE

Cancel storing an entry by pressing at any time during the process.

Entering names

Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter names in the phonebook. For instance to enter the name Paul.

Enter a pause

If your Colombo Neue is connected to a switchboard, you may need to enter a pause in a stored number. This gives the switchboard time to get an outside line. A pause is normally stored after the switchboard access code (e.g. 0)

1. When storing a number, press and hold $\underline{\mathbf{Q}}$ until the display shows \mathbf{R} . You can then continue storing the phone number.

View an entry

In standby:

- Press ▼.
- Enter the first letter of the name to search alphabetically then scroll ▲ or ▼
 to the exact entry. The name is displayed.
- 3. Press act to display the number. If there are more than 12 digits, press again to see the rest of the number.
- 4. Press To return to standby.

During a call:

- 1. Press ok to open the phonebook menu.
- Enter the first letter of the name you want then scroll ▲ or ▼ if necessary
 to the exact name. Press c to display the number. If there are more than 12
 digits, press c again to see the rest of the number.
- 3. Press to cancel the phonebook display.
- 4. Press again to end the call.

Edit an entry

- 1. Press ▼.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want to edit and press ^{menu}_{ok}. Edit is displayed. Press ^{menu}_{ok} again.
- 3. Edit the name and press $^{\text{menu}}_{\ \ \text{oK}}$ to confirm. Use $^{\text{8G}}_{\ \ \text{c}}$ to delete characters.
- 4. Edit the number. Press $_{\mathbf{OK}}^{\mathbf{menu}}$ to confirm.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Delete an entry

- Press ▼.
- 2. Scroll to the entry you want to delete and press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{ oK}}$.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to **Delete** and press on.
- 4. Display shows Confirm?. Press $_{\text{ok}}^{\text{menu}}$.
- 5. Press To return to standby.

List entry

You can also view, edit and delete an entry through the phonebook menu.

- 1. Press ok twice to open the phonebook menu.
- 2. **List Entry** is displayed, press ox.
- 3. You can now follow the instructions in the previous sections from step 2.

Delete all entries

- 1. Press ok twice.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Delete All and press on.
- 3. Display shows Confirm?. Press ox.
- 4. Press 🛜 to return to standby.

Store a direct memory number

- 1. Press ok twice.
- Key 1 is displayed. Press on the control of the contr
- 4. Scroll \P to **Key X**, where **X** is the keypad number where the entry will be stored. Press or .
- Add is displayed. Press ок.
- 7. Press of to return to standby.

NOTE

Only numbers that have been stored in the phonebook can then be stored as direct memory numbers.

To dial direct memory numbers, see "Dial direct memory numbers 1 to 9" on page 15.

CALLER ID AND CALL LIST

If you have subscribed to Caller ID and provided the identity of the caller is not withheld, the number of the caller will be displayed together with the date and time of the call.

NOTE

If the caller's number is stored in your phonebook along with a name, the name will be displayed along with the date and time of the call.

Information about incoming calls will vary by country and network operator. Some operators may charge a subscription for their Caller ID service.

If the number is unavailable, **Unavailable** will be displayed.

If the caller has withheld their number, Withheld will be displayed.

If the call is from a payphone, Payphone will be displayed.

Call list

The Call list contains details of missed and received call. Details include the date and time of the call. Entries are displayed in chronological order with the most recent call at the top of the list.

NOTE

- When the Call list is full, a new call replaces the oldest in the list.
- The received and missed Call list holds details of up to 50 calls.
- When you have missed calls (incoming calls that you haven't answered) the icon will flash on the display on all handsets registered to the base.
- If one handset is used to view the Call list, the icon on the other handsets will disappear (Multipack user only).

View the Call list

- Press ▲ to enter the Call List.
 - The most recent number or name if stored in the phonebook is displayed.
 Missed calls are marked with vicon flashing.
- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ through the Call list.
 - Press cto see the number. If the number has more than 12 digits, press cto see the rest of the number.
- Press to return to standby.

NOTE

The wicon stops flashing once all missed calls have been viewed.

Dial from the Call list

Press ▲ to enter the Call List. The most recent call is displayed.

- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- 3 Press to dial

Save a number from the Calls list to the phonebook

- 1. Press ▲ to enter the **Call List**. The most recent call is displayed.

- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the number you want.
- 3. Press ok then scroll ▼ to Delete and press ok.
- 4. Display shows **Confirm?**. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press To return to standby.

Delete entire Call list

- 1. Press ▲ to enter the **Call List**. The most recent call is displayed.
- 2. Press ok then scroll ▼ to Delete All and press ok.
- 3. Display shows **Confirm?**. Press or to confirm.

The Colombo Neue lets you redial any of the last 10 numbers called. Numbers can be up to $24\,\mathrm{digits}$ long.

Redial the last number

- 1. Press redial. The last number dialled is displayed.
 - If the number is stored in the Phonebook, the name is displayed. Press
 to see the number. If the number has more than 12 digits, the display shows ▶ and the cursor blinks. Press
- 2. Press 4 to dial.

View and dial a number in the redial list

- Press redial. The last number dialled is displayed.
 If required, scroll ▲ or ▼ to display the number you want.
- 2. Press 4 to dial the number.

Copy a redial number to the phonebook

- 1. Press redial and scroll \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to the entry you want and press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{ok}}$.
- 2. Display shows Save Number. Press $_{\mathbf{o}\kappa}^{\mathbf{menu}}$.
- 3. Enter the name and press $_{\rm oK}^{\rm menu}$.
- 4. Edit the number if required and press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{oK}}$.
- 5. Press to return to standby.

Delete a redial list entry

- 1. Press redial. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to display the number you want.
- 2. Press oκ and scroll ▼ to Delete then press oκ.
- 3. Display shows **Confirm?**. Press ok to confirm.
- 4. Press To return to standby.

Delete entire redial list

- 1. Press redial then press ok.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangledown to **Delete All** and press ${}^{\text{menu}}_{\text{o}\kappa}$.
- 3. Display shows **Confirm?**. Press oct to confirm.

CLOCK AND ALARM

If you subscribe to your network's Caller ID service and Auto clock is set to on, the time on your Colombo Neue will be set automatically each time you receive a call.

You can also set or adjust the time using the Clock/Alarm menu.

Set date and time

- 1. Press ok, scroll ▼ to Clock/Alarm and press ok.
- 2. Display shows Date & Time, then press ok .
- Enter the date using the format DD-MM-YY e.g. 04/12/15 for 4 December 2015 and press on .
- Enter the time using the 24 hour format HH:MM, e.g. 14:45 for 02.45pm and press on .
- 5. Press To return to standby.

Set alarm

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Clock/Alarm and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to **Set Alarm** and press ok .

- 5. Press to return to standby.

 When the alarm goes off, press any key to stop the ring.

NOTE

Once the alarm is set to on, the 💆 icon is displayed.

The alarm will ring at the medium level. Alarm ${
m On}$ and the ${
m \findal{M}}$ will flash on the display.

Set alarm melody

There are 3 alarm melodies.

- 1. Press $_{\text{ok}}^{\text{menu}}$ and scroll \blacktriangledown to Clock/Alarm.
- 2. Press ok .
- Scroll ▼ to Alarm Tone and press ^{menu} ok .
 The current melody is played.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select a melody.
- 5. Press ok to confirm.
- 6. Press 🖘 to return to standby.

Switch auto clock on / off

If you have subscribed to a Caller ID service, the date and time will be set on all your handsets whenever a call is received. This feature can be set to On or Off.

- 1. Press ок, scroll to Clock/Alarm and press ок.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangledown to **Auto clock** and press $\frac{menu}{ok}$.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to **On** or **Off** then press ok to confirm.
- 4. Press to return to standby.

PERSONAL SETTINGS

Handset tones

IMPORTANT

When the phone is ringing, avoid holding the earpiece too close to your ear as it may damage your hearing.

Ring volume

Choose from 5 levels and off.

- 1. Press ok, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press ok.
- 2. **Handset Tone** is displayed. Press menu ok .
- 3. **Ring Volume** is displayed. Press oK.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to adjust the ringer volume level.
- 5. Press $_{oK}^{menu}$ to save the settings.
- 6. Press To return to standby.

Ring melody

Choose from 10 ringer melodies.

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oK.
- 2. Handset Tone is displayed. Press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{oK}}$ and scroll \blacktriangledown to Ring Melody. Press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{oK}}$.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the melody.
 A sample of the melody is played.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- Press to return to standby.

Key tones on/off

When you press a key on the handset you hear a beep. You can switch these beeps on or off.

- 1. Press oκ, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oκ.
- 2. Handset Tone is displayed. Press on and scroll ▼ to Key Tone. Press on on the contract of - 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select On or Off.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- Press to return to standby.

Docking tones on/off

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oK.
- 2. Handset Tone is displayed. Press on and scroll ▼ to Docking tone. Press on and scroll ▼ to Docking tone.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select On or Off.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- Press sto return to standby.

Handset name

Personalise your handset, with a name or location for example Peter or Bedroom. Maximum 10 characters.

- 1. Press $_{\text{oK}}^{\text{menu}}$, scroll \blacktriangledown to Personal Set and press $_{\text{oK}}^{\text{menu}}$.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangledown to **Handset Name** and press ${}^{\text{menu}}_{\text{OK}}$. The current name is displayed.
- 3. Press contract to delete the current name.
- 4. Enter the name you want maximum 10 characters and press σκ to save.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Auto pick up

With auto pick up switched on, you can answer a call by simply lifting the handset off the base or charger. If switched off, you will have to press \checkmark to answer a call. The default setting is **Off**.

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Auto Pick-Up. Press ok.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Auto hang up

With Auto hang up switched on, you can end a call by simply replacing the handset on the base or charger. If switched off, you have to press $\$ to hang up. The default setting is $\$ **On**.

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Auto Hang-Up. Press ok.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press To return to standby.

Display language

You can change the display language.

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Language. Press menu ok .
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select the language you want.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Backlight on/off

- 1. Press ok, scroll ▼ to Personal Set and press ok.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Backlight. Press ox.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select On or Off.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Keypad lock

Prevent accidental dialling while carrying the handset by locking the keypad. While the keypad is locked, you can answer incoming calls as normal.

- Press and hold * a.
 The display shows Keys Locked .
- 2. To unlock the handset, press and hold * a again.

ADVANCED SETTINGS

Call list

You can set Call list type to All calls or Missed calls only. If All calls is selected, press \triangle in idle to view all calls. If Missed calls is selected, press \triangle in idle to view missed calls only.

- 1. Press oκ, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oκ.
- 2. Call List is displayed. Press ox.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to All calls or Missed calls.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press of to return to standby.

Conference

When the feature is set to Auto, if handset 1 is on line with an external caller, handset 2 can seize the line and immediately join the call with handset 1 and the external caller.

- 1. Press ок , scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press ок .
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Conference. Press ok.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to Auto or Off.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press to return to standby.

Auto prefix

You can set the Colombo Neue to detect a dialling number and replace it with another number. The number to be detected can be up to 5 digits long. It can be replaced with a number up to 10 digits.

- 1. Press oK, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to **Auto prefix**. Press nenu ok.
- 3. Digit Detect is displayed.
- 4. Enter the number you want to be detected and press $_{\rm o K}^{\rm menu}$
- 5. Prefix Num. is displayed.
- 6. Enter the number you want it replaced with and press or or
- 7. Press 😭 to return to standby.

Recall time

This setting is useful to access certain network and PABX/switchboard services.

The default Colombo Neue recall time is suitable for the Telstra network. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- 1. Press oκ, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oκ.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the setting you want: Short, Medium, Long.
- 4. Press ok to confirm.
- Press sto return to standby.

NOTE

The functionality of your Colombo Neue cannot be guaranteed on all PABX.

Registration

Up to 4 handsets can be registered to one base station. Additional handsets must be registered to the base before you can use them.

 The Master PIN is required before you can register or unregister handsets. The default PIN is 0000.

Register a handset

At the base:

 Press and hold the button on the base for 5 seconds. You have 120 seconds in which to register a handset.

On the handset:

- 1. If the handset is not register to a base press $\frac{menu}{o\kappa}$, then enter the base PIN and press or .
- If the handset is already register to a base, press on, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press on.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Register and press ok.
- When the display shows PIN, enter the base PIN and press of the handset registers with the base, it is assigned a handset number.

De-register a handset

Use one handset to delete another. You cannot delete the handset that you are using.

- 1. Press $_{oK}^{menu}$, scroll \blacktriangledown to Advanced Set and press $_{oK}^{menu}$.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangledown to **Unregister** and press ${}^{\text{menu}}_{\text{oK}}$.
- 3. Enter the 4 digit master PIN and press ox.

 Display shows the first registered handset number.
- 4. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select the handset you want to delete and press ok.

PIN

The 4-digit master PIN is used when registering or de-registering a handset and when changing some settings on your Colombo Neue. The default setting is 0000. You can change this PIN for more security.

- 1. Press oκ, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oκ.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to PIN. Press ok.
- 3. Enter the new PIN and press ok.
- 4. Re-enter the new PIN and press ok to confirm.
- 5. Press to return to standby.

NOTE

Make a note of your PIN. If you forget your PIN you will need to reset your product.

Reset

This will reset your Colombo Neue to its default settings.

- 1. Press oK. scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Reset. Press or.
- 3. Confirm? is displayed. Press ок.

NOTE

Entries stored in the phonebook are retained.

Eco mode

If you have a Colombo Neue with only one handset registered to the base the phone offers an Eco mode function which reduces the transmitted power and energy consumption when switched on. This feature is set to **Off** by default.

You can set the range of the Eco mode, e.g. when in a larger building set the range to **House** and the handset shouldn't lose its link with the base when Eco mode is turned on

1. Press $_{\text{ok}}^{\text{menu}}$, scroll \blacktriangledown to Advanced Set and press $_{\text{ok}}^{\text{menu}}$.

- Scroll to the required range either House, Apartment or Room and press on switch FCO mode off select Off.
- 5. Press 7 to return to standby.

A confirmation beep is emitted and when the range is set and the $^{\rm F}_{\rm II}$ icon shows on the display.

NOTE

If you have 2 or more handsets registered to the base this feature is not available, if you select **Range select** you will just hear a double beep.

Zero emit

When Zero emit is activated and the unit has been idle for 1 minute the transmitted power between the handset and the base will stop, an incoming call or pressing any key will activate the unit and it will revert back to the normal mode. This feature is set to **Off** by default.

- 1. Press oκ, scroll ▼ to Advanced Set and press oκ.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangledown to **ECO Mode** and press ${}^{\text{menu}}_{\text{o}\kappa}$.
- 3. **Zero Emit** is displayed, press ox.
- 4. Press \triangle or \blacktriangledown to select **On** or **Off**. Press $^{\text{menu}}_{\text{oK}}$ to confirm.
- Press sto return to standby.

A confirmation beep is emitted and when Zero emit is set to 0n and the \P icon shows on the display.

HFIP

The icon is not scrolling during charge

- Bad battery contact move the handset slightly.
- · Dirty contact Clean the battery contact with a cloth moistened with alcohol.
- Battery is full no need to charge.

No dialling tone

- No power check the connections. Reset the phone: unplug and plug back in the mains.
- Batteries are empty charge the batteries for at least 24 hours.
- · You are too far from the base move closer to the base.
- Wrong line cable use the line cable provided.
- Line adaptor (when needed) is not connected to the line cord connect the line adaptor (when needed) to the line cord.

Poor audio quality

 The base is too close to electrical appliances, reinforced concrete walls or metal door frames – move the base at least one metre away from any electrical appliances.

The III icon is blinking or has disappeared

- Handset is not registered to the base register the handset to the base.
- You are too far from the base move closer to the base.

No ring tone

- The ring tone is deactivated.
- Increase the volume.

Caller ID service does not work

Check your subscription with your network operator.

A phonebook entry cannot be stored

The phonebook is full. Delete an entry to free memory.

No display

- · Try recharging the batteries.
- Try disconnecting and connecting the base power supply.
- If LED is not lit up, then try disconnecting and connecting the base power supply.

Unable to register another handset

- Maximum number of 4 handsets has been reached.
- The display shows Searching. You must unregister a handset in order to register a new one.

Noise interference on your radio or television

Your base or charger may be too close. Move it as far away as possible.

APPENDIX

Care

Your telephone is a sophisticated product in terms of design and construction, and should therefore be handled with care.

To clean the telephone, wipe first with an antistatic cloth or a damp, soft leather cloth and then dry using a dry cloth.

Disposing of the rechargeable battery

All used batteries must be recycled and should not disposed of in domestic waste. Please dispose of them according to the official regulations. Take them to a recycling depot.
